



RBI Guide to calculating your APS

An Admission Point Score (APS) is a method used by institutions of higher learning to decide whether to admit a student or not. Students are required to have a predetermined APS to study specific fields.

How to calculate your score?

APS is calculated based on the results a student attains.

To understand how the APS is determined and how you can calculate yours before applying, see below example:

| NSC Level | APS |
|-----------|-----|
| 80 - 100% | 7 |
| 70 - 79% | 6 |
| 60 - 69% | 5 |
| 50 - 59% | 4 |
| 40 - 49% | 3 |
| 30 - 39% | 2 |
| 0 - 29% | 1 |

| Subject | Percentage | APS |
|---------------------------------|------------|-----|
| Afrikaans home language | 60% | 5 |
| English first language | 55% | 4 |
| Mathematics | 72% | 6 |
| Accounting | 52% | 4 |
| Design | 50% | 4 |
| Computer Application Technology | 55% | 4 |
| APS | | 27 |
